

TEACHING LISTENING & SPEAKING FOR UPPER PRIMARY & LOWER SECONDARY

Planning and organising lessons for learners to practise listening and speaking in English can be a big challenge for teachers. *Teaching Listening and Speaking* enables teachers to review their own practice in the teaching of listening and speaking. It begins by helping teachers explore their own beliefs and attitudes towards the teaching of listening and speaking. Teachers then reflect on the principles and issues related to the teaching of these skills.

The course also aims to enhance teachers' pedagogical knowledge and skills by revisiting the frameworks for teaching listening and speaking. Teachers will explore these theoretical frameworks and consider how they may be implemented in the classroom. In the workshop session, teachers will have the opportunity to plan lesson outlines and design teaching materials for their classrooms.

Objectives

The course is intended to allow participants to:

- explore and address issues and challenges in teaching listening and speaking based on classroom experiences
- study and apply the principles related to the teaching of listening and speaking
- apply the frameworks for teaching of listening and speaking for their classrooms
- identify and explore different types of activities for listening and speaking lessons
- understand the implications for selection, adaptation and design of

materials for teaching listening and speaking

Content

The topics covered include:

- Exploring Beliefs About Listening And Speaking
- Issues And Challenges In Teaching Listening And Speaking
- Principles for Teaching Listening And Speaking
- Frameworks for Teaching Listening And Speaking
- Adapting Materials For Listening And Speaking
- Planning & Teaching Listening And Speaking Lessons

Duration

3 days (18 hours)

The course uses a variety of instructional strategies which include lectures, group discussions, oral presentations and collaborative activities in a workshop setting.
